

#### **Acocks Green Focus Group**

Acocks Green Focus Group is a local campaign group concerned with the physical appearance of Acocks Green. They campaign for re-design where they think it is needed (e.g. road layout in the centre of Acocks Green) whilst also trying to help keep attractive local buildings, trees and green spaces.

Current issues on their agenda include:

- The proposed Smart Route on the Warwick Road, that runs through Acocks Green centre. It is likely that the Warwick Road will become single carriageway with more space for parking, pedestrians and, hopefully, trees and plants. The Focus Group will be continuing to support this new look for the Warwick Road as the first stage of the Smart Route scheme.
- Making sure that Acocks Green has input into the new Birmingham 2026 Core Strategy Document. This involves an overall plan for every suburb in Birmingham. Find out more at the Public Meeting or submit your views via the Focus Group's website.
- Local buildings: It is likely that a plan will be submitted to the City Council Planning involving the demolition of the 1920's Arts & Crafts style, Grade-A locally listed, Glynn Edwards Hall on the corner of Yardley and Alexander Road, in order to replace it with a modern building with a large area of plate glass. The Focus Group have serious concerns about the effect this will have on the appearance of the area.
